Main Threats to British Owls

- Starvation due to loss of vole-rich hunting habitats
- Drowning in water troughs
- Fatal collisions with motor vehicles when along roadside verges
- Poisoning by the use of rodenticides
- Loss of nest sites through extreme weather and development

Ways to Help Wild Owls

- Create and conserve rough grassland to encourage voles
- Rotting woodpiles are a useful source of invertebrate for little owls
- Planting fruit & nut trees will boost wood mouse numbers for tawny owls
- A bread basket or cloth left in a water trough can help an owl get out if it falls in
- If you find an owl chick, leave it alone unless it is injured and needs first aid
- Install a Wild Owl nesting box to offer owls a home (near suitable habitat)
